

School Ski Program

Last month saw another very successful School Ski Program. Eight elementary schools from SD83 participated in the annual program in preparation of the Pirate Loppet, bringing a total of about 340 students to practice their skiing and to have some serious fun in our beautiful Larch Hills outdoors. Schools chose to come up twice or three times in the month of January (for some 800 student visits!), and each time groups of about 10 children were lead around our trails by one LHNS member volunteer, with the help of another adult provided by the schools. Forty intrepid club members came forward to volunteer their time for one, two and even four sessions each. New this year were a couple of video links on the snowplow and herringbone skills the teachers were encouraged to view with their students before the sessions, and an orientation session put on by Pat Hutchins for the volunteer hosts. Feedback has been extremely positive from the schools and many of the volunteers alike, and sometimes I wasn't so sure who enjoyed this program the most. Thank you LHNS volunteers for allowing this very worthwhile program to take place and grow year after year!

School Ski Host Program and Pirate Loppet 2016

Ski Host Program

This year, eight area schools took part in the Ski Host Program. Schools had two or three sessions, with the result being 793 student ski visits to Larch Hills through January. Many thanks to the forty Larch Hills volunteers who acted as ski hosts and to Karin Wilkie for coordinating the program.

Pirate Loppet

This year's event on January 29th had over 500 skiers preregister with 465 skiers actually taking part. Fourteen areas schools were represented as well as additional skiers from Revelstoke. The official Pirate Loppet Flag for the school with the highest per capita participation went to Grindrod Elementary.

In an attempt to make the event more inclusive, a 2 kilometre course was added this year as an option for younger or less experienced skiers. Over one hundred skiers chose to ski the 2 K route, proving to be a popular option.

Thanks to the many club volunteers and the local business community for helping to make this year's event another great success. A special shout out to Dorothy Parks and the Lady Striders who, since 2005, have served up over 6,500 hot dogs to about 5,000 pirates young and old.

Skis for Schools Grants

Once again, funds are being made available to local schools for the purchase of cross-country ski equipment for their students. Applications are currently being accepted, with a deadline of Feb. 10th.

The option of purchasing pizza later in the evening was again well-received and the choice of a DJ to provide music appeared to be a hit with a good cross section of ages judging by the action on the dance floor!

This was my second year as a coordinator of the annual event and I could not have asked for more enthusiastic and committed volunteers, especially the individual coordinators, who made my job so much easier by contacting volunteers and directing them using their wealth of experience. Also using our new sled and a second snowmobile expedited our set up and tear down.

No significant safety incidents were reported although we will endeavour to put a few more lanterns on the hill coming in to the South Hub as there was the odd tumble. I calculated that 199 hours of volunteer work went into this event.

Tracksetter Report

I am very pleased to report that this has been a great year for snow and tracksetting. All our volunteers have gone above and beyond the call of duty to ensure a high standard of tracksetting and I am grateful to each one of them. I would like to recognize Jim Nadler who has been with me every step of the way, along my steep learning curve, and I thank him for all his help and support.

Since, I started as liaison director last year, there have been some changes in personnel with retirements and new recruitments. Stephen Raffel is now the tracksetter of the day coordinator with Wayne Buchanan as his alternate. John Thielman, George Jackson, and Bent Kristiansen have joined the day tracksetter list operating the PistenBully. We have some spare tracksetters we can call on as well. In addition Blaine Carson and Jim Ellis have joined the active but retired list. Many thanks to Blaine and Jim for their contributions as a day tracksetters.

We have increased our Extra Gang snowmobile crew to nine with two trained on the Ginzug groomer. We hope to increase this number by training the other interested members, on the Ginzug groomer, as soon as possible. Most will also need to complete a chain saw course, hopefully in the fall.

In early January I submitted a tracksetter log and volunteer hour summary to our president. Worthy of note in this report is that the tracksetters and support personnel accounted for 1918 hrs. of volunteer time contribution. The PistenBully (PB) operated for 460 machine hours with a total of 686 man hours. The snow mobiles added up to 2729 km or 423.5 machine hours and 562.5 total man hours.

The machines are running well with the occasional minor breakdown mostly of a hydraulic nature. We are still hoping to find a missing shovel with a rubber tip designed specifically for the PB. We look forward to sending some of our tracksetters to the 2016 National Nordic Sports Grooming Conference from April 4-6 at Sovereign Lakes Nordic Centre, Vernon.

Somehow under my list of other duties I became the liaison director for outhouses. It seemed there was no rush by other directors to take this on, I am not sure why but in any case we have recruited a volunteer to check, clean and supply the 10 outhouses and Cec's Cabin on a weekly basis. We have repaired three outhouses to date. This schedule satisfies the requirement of our Partnership Agreement.

Since the middle of December I have been writing the trail report on our website and facebook. I have tried to make the information relevant and not repeating information

already on the website. The grooming report is updated by the tracksetters when they are done for the day. The Delorme is also available for public use but more of an emergency tool for us. Both of these tools I rely on for my report. I have also recently added a back country section which is updated whenever new information becomes available to me. For the trail report to continue I would like to recruit someone to fill in for me when I am not available so if you know of anyone let me know.

I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the whole tracksetting team for all their help and support. Specifically, Stephen Raffel, for planning and coordinating under sometimes difficult conditions or events, Wayne Buchanan for being a patient and supportive Ginzug groomer teacher, and finally John Thielman for using his skill and expertise to, not only groom and trackset, but also help with special events and clearing snow so we can actually park and enjoy the skiing.

Before I conclude, I would like to recognize Blaine Carson for his years of service to our Club by recruiting, training and mentoring most of us. Blaine has been the heart and soul of the tracksetting team and we owe him our deepest gratitude. I know we will all work very hard and strive to maintain the high bar that he set for us. We wish him well.
